What are we building on...?

Investigating and interpreting the past through observing or handling evidence. Asking questions and finding answers to questions about the past.

Building an overview of World history through -

- Knowledge of society—where they were born and family life.
- Knowledge of location—where in the world they made their name.
- Knowledge of conflicts—wars that took place.

Understanding chronology

Show an understanding of concepts of; nation and a nation's history, civilisation, monarchy, parliament, democracy and war and peace.

Use artefacts, pictures, stories, online sources and databases to find out about the past.

What should we know?,

That Isaac Newton was a scientist, Alexander Graham Bell was an inventor. Florence Nightingale was a nurse and Hans Cristian Anderson was a writer.

Pupils should know Florence Nightingale was a nurse during the Crimean war and the conditions of the hospitals.

What their achievements were.

The legacies they have left.

What should we be able to do?

Identify on a map where the individuals made their names.

Talk about the individuals early life and identify dates to create a timeline.

Organise information about the individual.

Suggest reasons why they have become so famous.

Show a basic understanding of gravity and its significance to science.

Investigate how Alexander Graham Bell's influential changes have made an impact on society today.

Explain how their inventions took place.

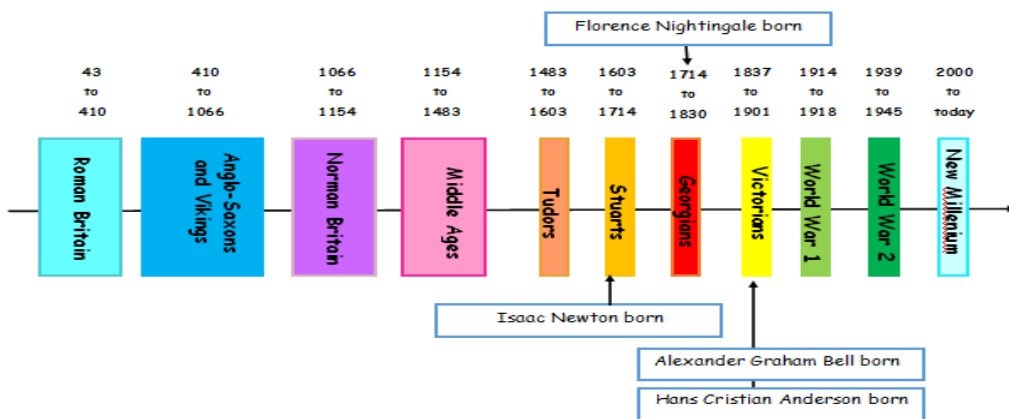
Discuss the importance of how and why Florence Nightingale dedicated her life to nursing and was shocked to find that many soldiers were wounded and that the poor, insanitary conditions were the cause of many soldiers dying.

Talk about Hans Cristian Andersons Fairy Tales and compare and contrast to today.

Explain changes in your own life due to the actions and inventions of the significant individuals.

Find out information about famous people who changed the world.
